Let's Get to It! Building an Emergency Fund

"That's life!" It's a phrase we are all familiar with and usually it pertains to an unexpected event or occurrence. Most of us have had to deal with something in life that caused what felt like a *financial emergency*: unexpected medical bills, appliances break down, a wedding, a funeral, car repairs, orthodontic braces, a study abroad opportunity, etc. Setting up an emergency fund is an essential way to prepare for such events. It can alleviate the stress and financial burden when unexpected financial expenses arise, and it can help you build your savings as

well. Here are some helpful tips for getting started whether you have a consistent monthly income, or are living paycheck to paycheck.

- 1. Decide where you will create and build this fund. For instance, First Trust offers a rainy day account or spare change account as a sub-account to your regular savings account. It's quick and easy to add one to your existing savings.
- 2. Start with small, regular contributions on a consistent basis. If you have your paychecks direct deposited, ask about allocating a certain amount of your paycheck into one sub-account, such as \$50 each paycheck. You can set up a recurring automatic deposit or a transfer into your emergency fund sub-account. If you live paycheck to paycheck, try to eliminate one expense and allocate that money to your fund instead.
- 3. Set small and realistic goals. Start with saving a small amount of money each paycheck or month. Be careful not to put too much stress on your normal cash flow, or you might be more prone to give up on your plan. You can always increase your contributions along the way as you feel more comfortable. You may be surprised at how fast your savings will grow.
- 4. Take advantage of one-time opportunities to save such as receiving a tax refund, holiday or birthday cash gifts, or a cash bonus at work. Putting all, or a portion, of this into your fund will help it grow faster. Another tip is to include an increase in your contribution each time you receive an increase in income, such as a pay raise at work.
- 5. It's a good idea to monitor your progress occasionally, and also celebrate your successes!
